

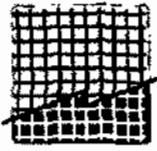


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**PREFACE**

This report contains the results of agricultural surveys undertaken in respect of 1994, 1995 and 1996 for the Republic of South Africa. The information concerns commercial farming units, excluding the former TBVC states and self-governing territories. The purpose of the surveys was to collect useful information for national and provincial planning, development, *policy formulation and marketing*. The information is used for benchmarking and re-basing of the quarterly Gross Domestic Product and for the calculation of the Gross Geographic Product.

### Interpretative summary

#### General

1. This report contains the results of information obtained from commercial farming units in respect of 1994, 1995 and 1996. Commercial farming units in the former TBVC states and self-governing territories were excluded. The report gives a breakdown of principal agricultural statistics such as the number of farming units, employment, salaries and wages, total gross income, expenditure and debt according to the nine provinces. The report is useful for planning in general, and agricultural development planning in particular, at both provincial and national levels.

#### Number and size of the farming units

2. During the period 1994 to 1996, most of the commercial farming units in South Africa were situated in the Free State followed by the Western Cape and North West (cf. table A). The largest farming units were recorded in the drier areas such as the Northern Cape where most of the farming land was used for grazing purposes and the average size of a farming unit was more than 4 000 hectares. The smallest farming units were recorded in Gauteng, where the average farming unit was approximately 300 hectares.

In 1996 farmers owned 64,7 million hectares or 78,7% of the available farming area. They rented or leased 16,8 million hectares (20,4%) and 0,7 million hectares were farmed on shares.

### Employment and salaries and wages

3. The results of the 1994, 1995 and 1996 agricultural surveys show that the commercial agricultural sector employs more than nine hundred thousand people. Employment decreased from 921 651 in February 1994 to 914 473 in February 1996. Nearly a third of the employees were casual and seasonal workers.

In February 1996 farmers in the Western Cape employed the largest number of paid employees (198 378 or 21,7%) followed by the Northern Province (121 757 or 13,3%) and the Free State (118 866 or 13,0%). Gauteng employed only 4,3% (39 295) farm workers (cf. table B). Most of the farm workers were Blacks (74,6%), followed by Coloureds (22,1%), Whites (3,1%) and Indians (0,3%).

The commercial agricultural sector paid R4 601 million in salaries and wages for the financial year which ended between 1 March 1995 and 29 February 1996 (cf table B). This amount represents 19,2% of the total expenditure (current and capital expenditure) by the sector for the same period (or 23,0% of total current expenditure by the sector). In addition, an estimated R1 150 million was paid to employees in other forms of remuneration such as payments in kind.

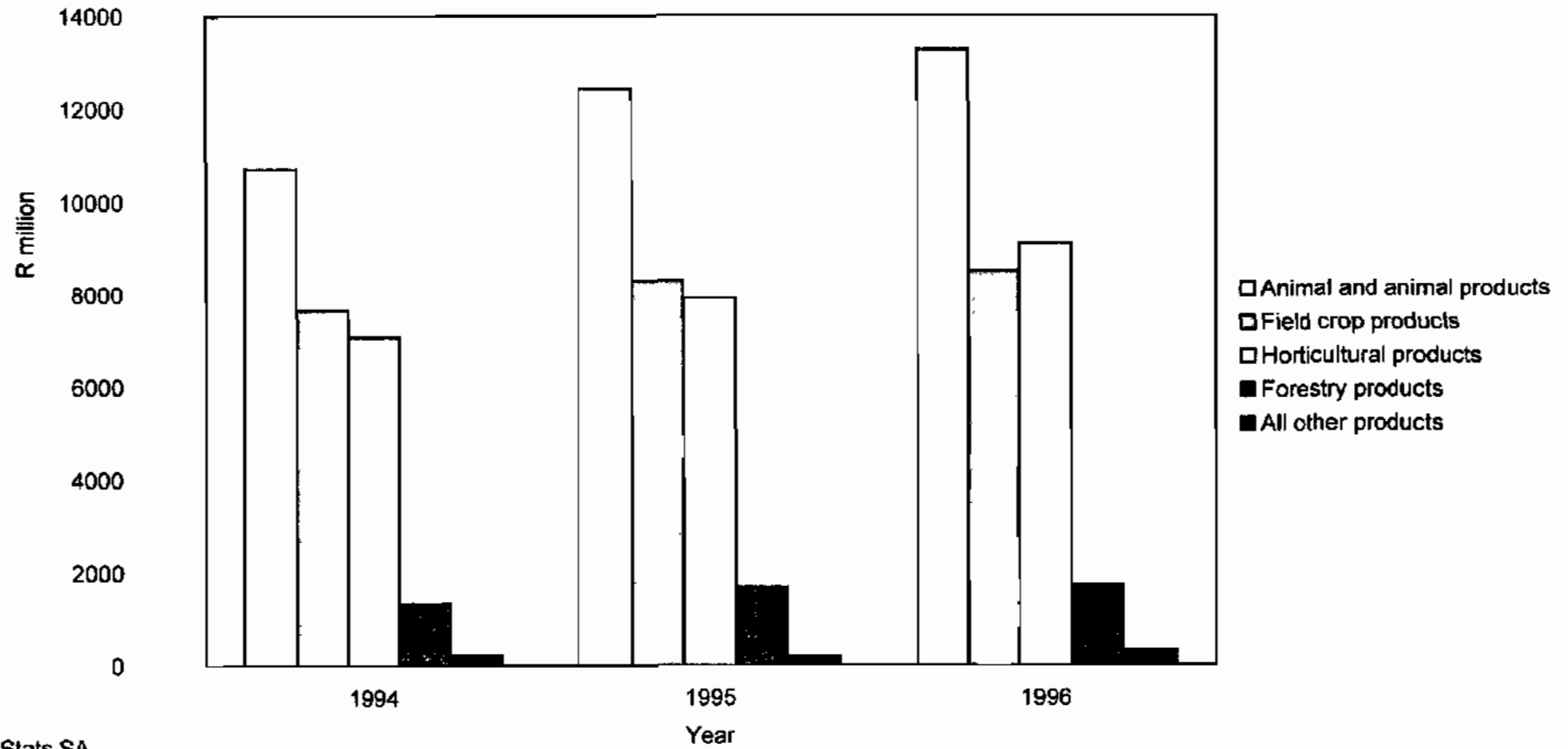
#### Total gross income

4. According to the 1994, 1995 and 1996 agricultural surveys the total gross income increased from R27 014 million in 1994 to R32 931 million in 1996.

More than R13 billion (or some 40,3%) of the total gross income generated in 1996 was from commercial farming in animals and animal products (cf. table C). Horticultural products and field crops contributed 27,6% and 25,8%, respectively. Despite higher rainfall recorded during 1995 and 1996, the percentage contribution of the different kinds of farming to the total gross income earned from farming hardly changed from 1994 to 1996 indicating that the structure of the agricultural sector remained fairly stable. Climatic conditions, topography and other geographic factors make it difficult for farmers to shift from one line of farming to another without adversely affecting the viability and profitability of their farming operations.

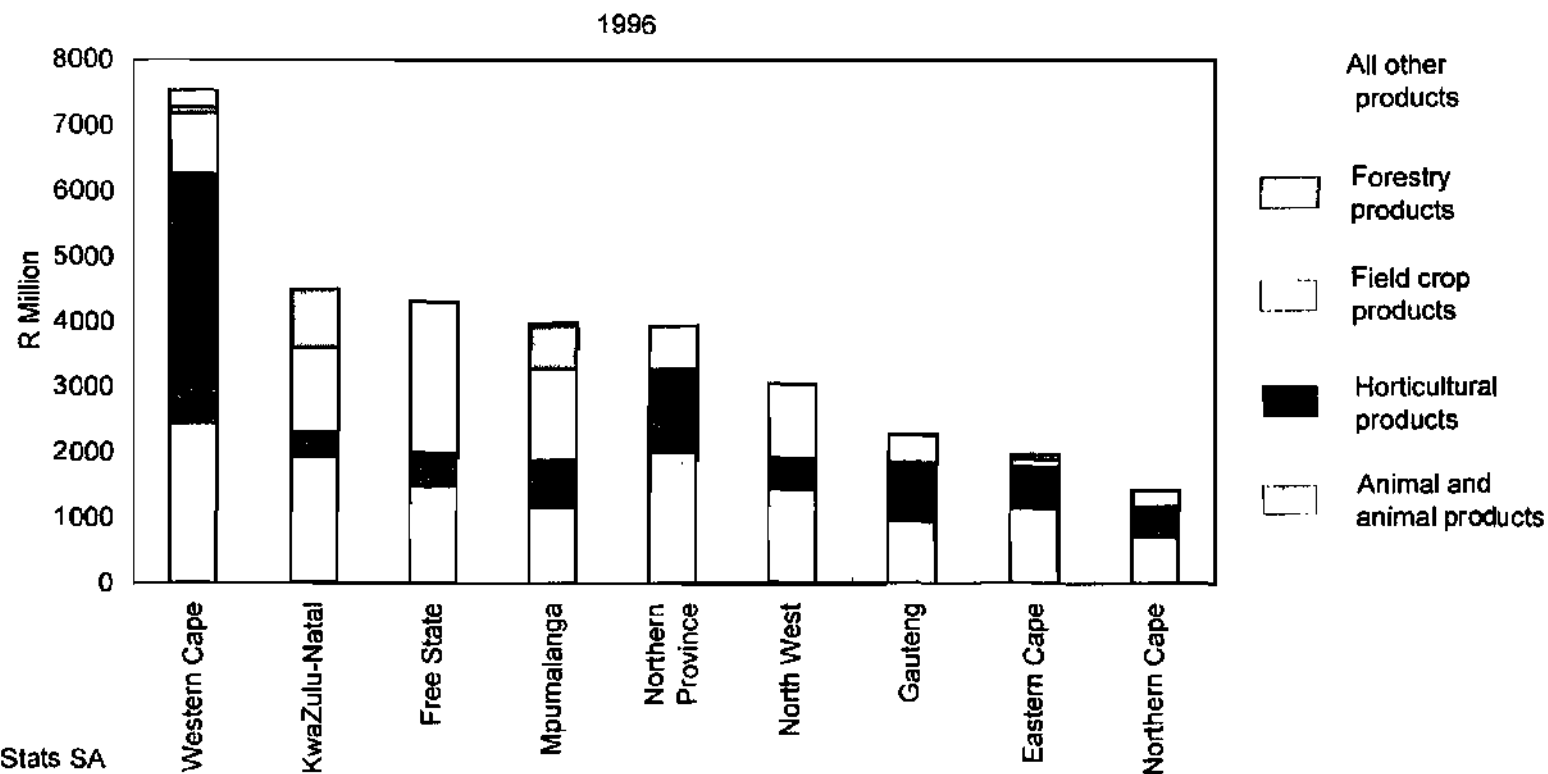
**Figure 1 - Income from agricultural products**

According to the 1996 survey, the dominant branch of farming in six of the provinces was commercial farming in animals and animal products. The largest incomes from animals and animal products were recorded by the Western Cape (R2 441 million), the Northern Province (R2 011 million), KwaZulu-Natal (R1 929 million) and the Free State (R1 482 million). The largest increases in field crop products were recorded by the Free State and Mpumalanga with incomes of R2 322 million and R1 397 million respectively. In the Western Cape the largest income (R3 819 million) was generated from horticultural products.

**Expenditure**

5. The total expenditure by the commercial agricultural sector increased from R19 633 million in 1994 to R23 962 million in 1996 (cf. table D). This amount represents 83,5% of current expenditure, while 16,5% was capital expenditure on new assets. Capital expenditure was 1,8 percentage points higher in 1996 than the R2 872 million in 1994.

In 1996 farmers in the Western Cape generated 22,9% of the total gross income of the agricultural sector. Furthermore, the Western Cape contributed 21,5% to the total expenditure for agricultural purposes.

## Farming debt

6. Farming debt amounted to approximately R19 000 million in 1996. The Western Cape contributed 19,0% to the overall farming debt in South Africa, followed by the Free State and KwaZulu-Natal, while Gauteng contributed the smallest amount (3,8%).

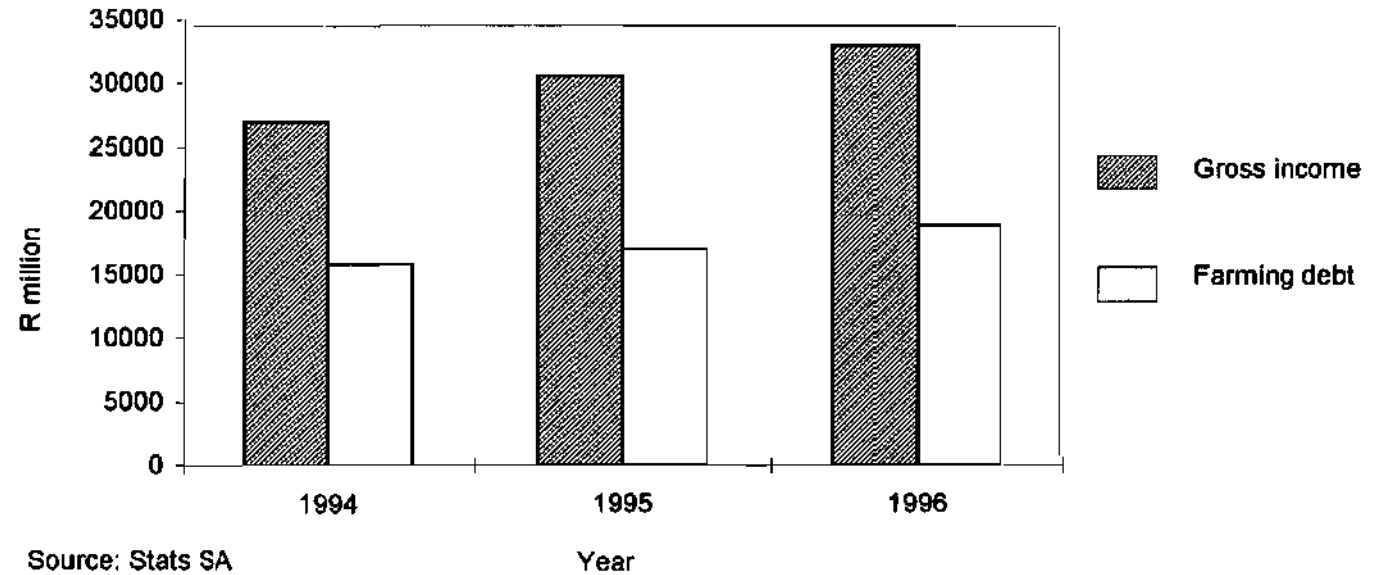

The overall debt ratio (farming debt/farming assets) increased from 22,9% in 1993 to 24,1% in 1996. This indicates a deterioration in the liquidity position of the commercial agricultural sector.

Commercial banks are the largest source of credit finance to the commercial agricultural sector (37,2%), followed by the Land Bank and the Agricultural co-operatives.

Information was obtained from commercial farmers in the Republic of South Africa who worked on their own farms or rented farms or farmed land on shares. Data in respect of farmers and farming units in the former TBVC states and the self-governing territories were excluded. Postal surveys were undertaken and completed questionnaires were rendered regarding farming activities.  |
| <b>Classification</b>                    | 3. The 1993 edition of the Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (SIC), Fifth Edition, was used to classify the statistical units in the surveys. The SIC is based on the 1990 International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC) with suitable adaptations for local conditions. Statistics in this publication are presented at SIC division level only.  |
| <b>Statistical unit</b>                  | 4. The statistical unit for the collection of information is a farming unit. A farming unit consists of one or more separate farms, holdings or portions of land whether contiguous or not, provided they are situated in the same magisterial district and are operated as a single unit. Farms or portions of land situated in different magisterial districts are regarded as separate farming units. The number of farming units, therefore, does not represent the number of farmers, as a specific farming unit can be operated by more than one farmer, and one farmer can operate more than one farming unit. |
| <b>Survey methodology and design</b>     | 5. These surveys were collected by mail from a sample of approximately 6 300 farmers.   |
| <b>Reference period</b>                  | 6. Completed questionnaires were rendered by all farming units regarding their financial year ending on any date between 1 March of the one year and 28/29 February of the following year. Therefore, land utilisation, employees' remuneration, gross farming income and expenditure, equipment purchased and amount spent on buildings erected and development work undertaken refer to the financial year of the farming unit which ended on any date between 1 March of the one year and 28/29 February of the following year.  |

However, details relating to the composition and area of the farming unit, the number of livestock, the number of paid employees/farm employees, the market value of farming assets and farming debts were called for as at 28/29 February of the relevant year.

- Comparability with previous censuses/surveys**
6. In comparing the results of these surveys with those of previous sample and census surveys the following should be borne in mind:
- Information regarding 1988 and 1993 was based on census surveys;
  - Information published for the intervening years was acquired by means of 10,0% sample surveys and was imputed to represent the total of all farming units;
  - Alterations in the boundaries of geographical areas;
  - Fluctuating climatic conditions;
  - Alterations in branches of farming and rotation of crops.

## GLOSSARY

### Farming unit

A farming unit is a unit on which the following farming operations are carried out for commercial purposes -

- the cultivation, in the open air or under cover, of field crops, fruit, grapes, nuts, seed, bulbs, vegetables or flowers;
- the operation of a nursery, except a nursery concentrating on purchasing and reselling;
- the operation of a tea, coffee, sugar, wood or other plantation;
- the breeding of livestock, poultry, game or other animals, including freshwater fish and furred animals, and including speculation in livestock; and
- the production of milk, cream, wool, fur, eggs or honey.

### Farmer

The farmer is the person, partnership, company, close corporation or other enterprise that operates the farming unit for his or its own account; or the manager, foreman or other person to whom the control of the farming unit was entrusted.

### Working proprietors/ tenants and family members

Family members actively involved in the farming operation and who do not receive regular salaries are included.

### Regular employee

Regular employees are employees who are employed on a permanent basis with benefits, e.g. leave.

### Casual and seasonal employees

Casual and seasonal employees include occasional and day labourers, e.g. shearers, reapers and fruit-pickers but exclude contractors and their employees.

### Other remuneration

Other remuneration includes the following -

- contributions to the Workmen's Compensation Fund and Unemployment Insurance Fund;
- contributions to a pension, medical and other such funds;
- payments in kind which include the value of rations such as maize, flour, slaughter animals, meat, fish, milk, wine, bread, coffee, sugar, tobacco, clothing, shoes, transport, training and medicine provided to farm workers, medical expenses paid on their behalf;
- rental value of free housing; and
- rental value of free land utilisation.

**Gross income**

Gross income is farming income earned from agricultural products sold.

The following branches of farming are included -

- field crop products;
- horticultural products;
- animals and animal products (e.g. income from livestock, poultry, game, fish and all other animals);
- forestry products; and
- all other products (e.g. income from wild flowers, compost and firewood).

The value of products and livestock sold, but for which payment has not yet been received is included.

Insurance payments received for cattle and harvest losses are included under the relevant branch of farming.

Where there is some processing of agricultural products on the farming unit, income obtained from the processing is shown against the product processed.

**Current expenditure**

Current expenditure includes -

- seed and plant material but excludes vine cuttings and plant material purchased for plantations and orchards;
- other agricultural services such as ploughing, harvesting, threshing, baling, picking, spraying and shearing rendered by, for example, contractors and co-operative societies;
- maintenance and repairs of all machinery, vehicles, agricultural implements, pumps and other equipment, including spare parts for motor vehicles, tractors and implements;
- insurance premiums of crops, buildings, vehicles, machinery, implements and animals; and
- other farming expenses such as banking costs and telephone accounts;

**Capital expenditure on fixed assets**

Capital expenditure on fixed assets includes -

- other buildings such as milking sheds, pigsties, poultry houses, calf pens, stables, barns, store-rooms, garages and other outbuildings;
- development work such as fencing erected, gates erected, boreholes, dams, troughs, canals, bush clearing, contour banks, irrigation and drainage furrows, pit silos, plunge dips, kraals, plastic tunnels, roads, bridges and power-lines;
- establishment costs of new orchards and plantations and the purchase of plant material, trellising material and the preparation and fertilisation of soil;
- goods vehicles such as pick-ups, jeeps and trucks; and
- all other equipment and implements include trailers, ploughs, planters, mowers, crop-spraying equipment, equipment for irrigation systems, milking machines, driers and computers.

**Market value of farming assets**

The market value of farming assets includes -

- farming land and fixed improvements (including structures, orchards, plantations and main lines (irrigation));
- vehicles, machinery, equipment and tools;
- animals (such as livestock, ostriches, poultry, game, fish and fur animals);
- crops on the land, fruit and other products not yet harvested; and
- other farming assets (such as harvested grain, fuel, fertilisers, packagings and wool clips not yet marketed).

**Farming debt**

Farming debt includes -

all obligations incurred for normal farming activities and for mortgages, loans and credit received from organisations such as banks, co-operative societies and private persons.
